LOCATION

Penang Island is a 20-minute ferry ride from Butterworth. Two bridges connect the island to the mainland: Penang Bridge and the Second Penang Bridge (Jambatan Sultan Abdul Halim Mu'adzam Shah). Penang International Airport sees incoming international flights from many countries such as China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Thailand, Indonesia, Taiwan, Vietnam and Qatar.

Langkawi Island is a 2 hours 45 minute ferry ride away, or a short 35-minute flight. Malaysia's capital Kuala Lumpur is a 50-minute flight away, or can alternatively be reached by a four-hour train or car ride.

The retail stands are located at the arrival hall, after you exit from the baggage claim area. Most convenience shops offer credit top-up services when your SIM card credit runs out.

WI-FI

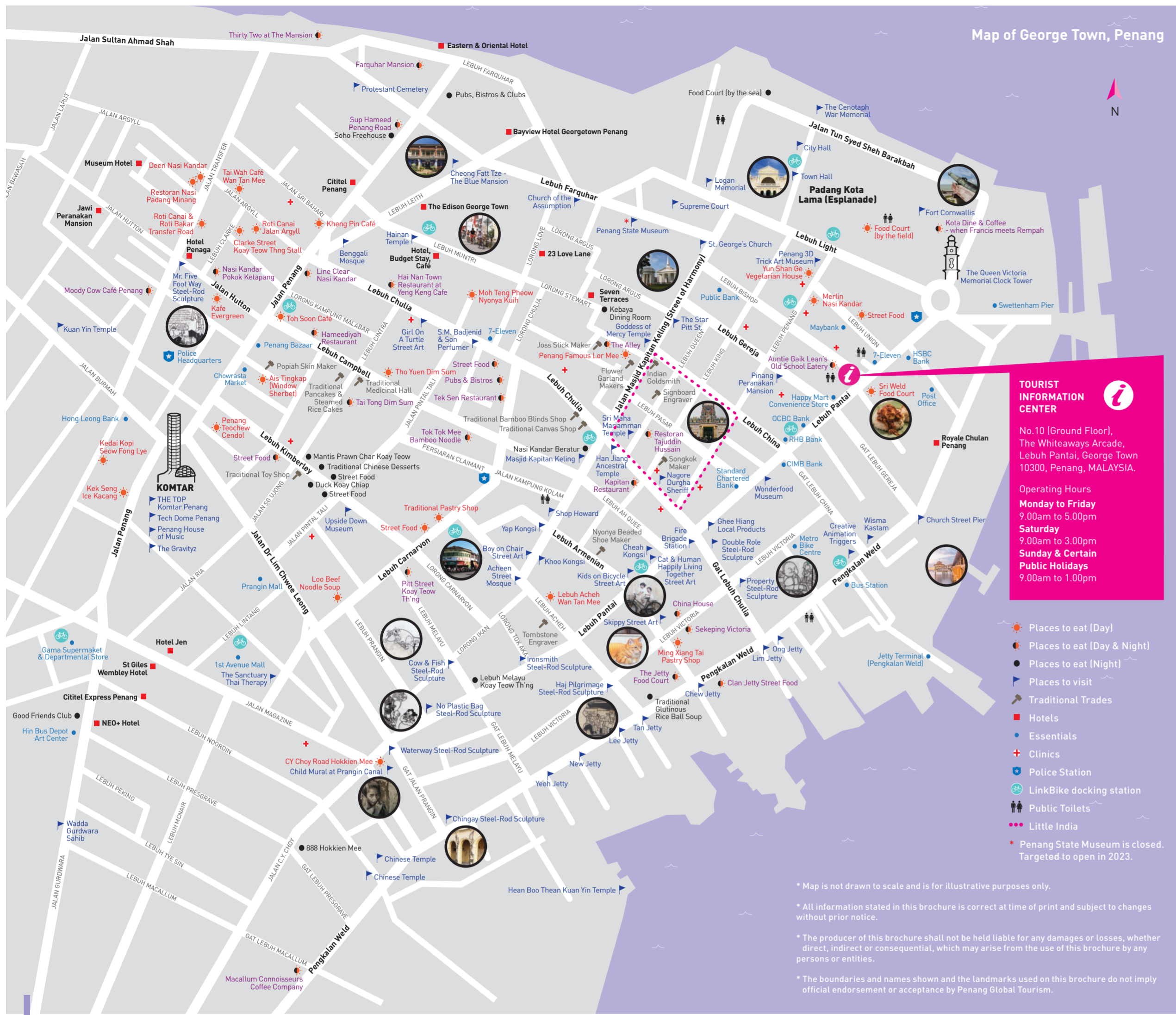
Penang has Wi-Fi networks befitting a tourist-friendly city. Wi-Fi is provided at the majority of the hotels and is available in most areas of the city.

There are 1,550 Wi-Fi spots at tourist attractions and public places throughout George Town. Most cafes also offer free Wi-Fi. For convenience, you may purchase a local SIM card with a data package to access the internet at all times.

CURRENCY

The Malaysian currency is the Ringgit, written as RM. There are six denominations: RM1, 5, 10, 20, 50 and 100.

STAY & RELAX

Penang offers a fantastic choice of accommodation to suit different needs and budgets, from luxury hotels, boutique hotels and serviced apartments, to budget hostels, beachfront guest houses, and exciting homestays.



GEORGE TOWN
 George Town has become a favourite with visitors because of its eclectic range of boutique accommodation, which includes beautifully restored traditional shophouses and hip, trendy hotels with hints of local flavours. A stay in the George Town UNESCO World Heritage Site is perfect for exploring George Town on foot, bicycle, motorcycle or trishaw.

GURNEY DRIVE
 Strategically located between the city and the beach, Gurney Drive's high-rise hotels offer breathtaking panoramas of the sea and city. For delightful street food, world-class shopping and nightlife, this iconic waterfront boulevard is where the action takes place.

TELUK BAHANG, BATU FERRINGHI, TANJUNG BUNGAH
 Penang's famous coastal strip up north, from Tanjung Bungah to Batu Ferringhi, is home to many 3 to 5-star beach resorts, with plenty of shopping, nightlife and eco-tourism activities close at hand. For an unforgettable kampung experience, there are homestays available in the smaller fishing villages close by.

SOUTHEAST ZONE
 The southeast zone is a stone's throw from the island's high-tech parks, the international airport, golf clubs, the two Penang bridges that connect the island to the mainland, and one of Penang's largest shopping malls. There is a wide variety of business-class hotels to choose from, as well as convention centres, including the Setia SPICE Convention Centre and the Penang Waterfront Convention Centre, which is scheduled for completion in a few years.

SEBERANG PERAI UTARA
 If you're looking to visit nearby attractions such as Butterworth Art Walk, these hotels will make Seberang Perai Utara your home away from home.

SEBERANG PERAI TENGAH
 This is the bustling side of Seberang Perai with a number of shopping malls. The Penang Bird Park – the first and largest bird park of its kind in Malaysia – is located here. The famous St Anne's Church is located in Bukit Mertajam; the Cherok Tokun relics can be found within the compounds of the church. There are more hotels in this area of Seberang Perai.

SEBERANG PERAI SELATAN
 Visit Nibong Tebal and the Bukit Pancho Recreational Forest, where you can experience the mangrove ecosystem, explore the surrounding bat caves and take a stroll on the wetland boardwalk.

HOMESTAYS
 Homestays in Penang provide an alternative to conventional hotels by offering affordable and comfortable accommodation for tourists who wish to stay with locals, or away from the city's hustle and bustle. Holiday-makers will get the chance to experience local cultures and lifestyles in a laid-back atmosphere. Participate in typically rural activities such as fishing, rubber-tapping, fruit-picking, craft-making and so on. Exchange stories with the locals, savour home-cooked meals and even possibly be part of a traditional wedding celebration, or get one organised for yourself!

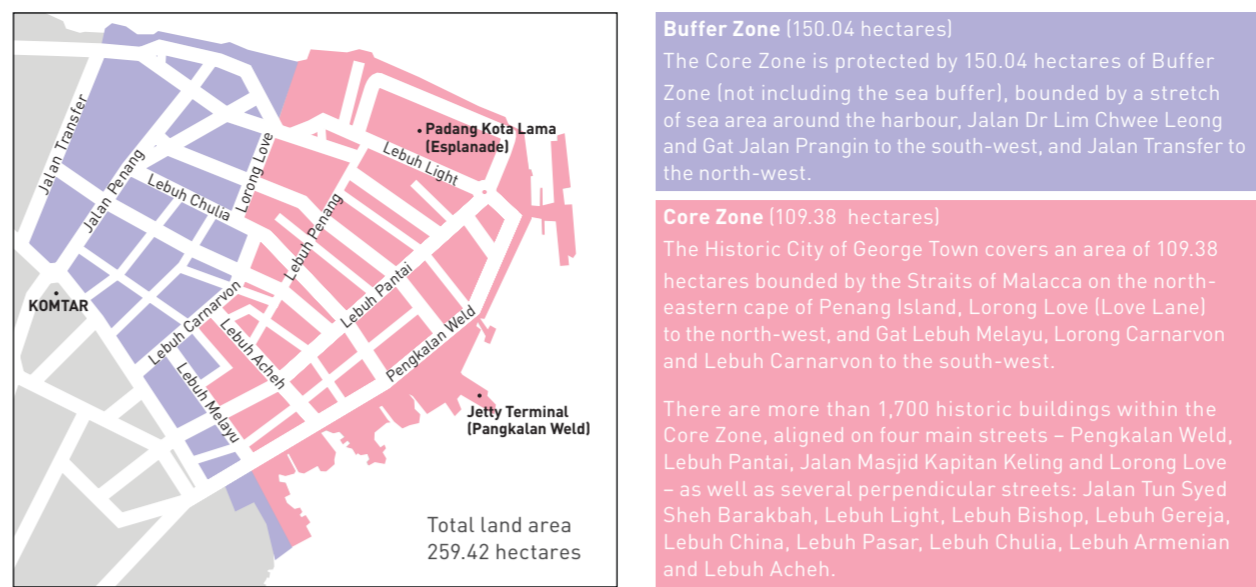

YACHT AND SUNSET CRUISE
 Yachts and cruises in Penang are the ideal options to relax and unwind at day's end and witness a legendary Penang sunset over the Straits of Malacca. One can easily opt to charter a yacht or hop on a cruise offered by selected hotels to enjoy a sunset cruise.

SPA & WELLNESS
 Experience real Penang indulgence at luxury spas or seek out traditional Asian medicine practitioners to melt those worries away. After a tiring day touring Penang, treat yourself to an indulgent evening.



Buffer Zone (150.04 hectares)
 The Core Zone is protected by 150.04 hectares of Buffer Zone (not including the sea buffer), bounded by a stretch of sea area around the harbour, Jalan Dr Lim Chiew Leong and Gat Jalan Prangin to the south-west, and Jalan Transfer to the north-west.

Core Zone (109.38 hectares)
 The Historic City of George Town covers an area of 109.38 hectares bounded by the Straits of Malacca on the north-eastern cape of Penang Island, Lorong Love (Love Lane) to the north-west, and Gat Lebuh Melayu, Lorong Carnarvon and Lebuh Carnarvon to the south-west.

There are more than 1,700 historic buildings within the Core Zone, aligned on four main streets – Pengkalang Weld, Lebuh Pantai, Jalan Masjid Kapitan Keling and Lorong Love – as well as several perpendicular streets: Jalan Tun Syed Sheh Barakbah, Lebuh Light, Lebuh Bishop, Lebuh Gereja, Lebuh China, Lebuh Pasar, Lebuh Chulia, Lebuh Armenian and Lebuh Aceh.

LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

Downtown Penang is small enough in size for walking around, especially George Town and its surroundings. One can take in the sights in a trishaw or on a Link Bike. Alternatively, a free shuttle bus service, the Central Area Transit (CAT) bus, provides a convenient way of moving around town.

To get to attractions outside George Town – such as Kek Lok Si Temple, Penang Hill, Batu Ferringhi and Teluk Bahang – standard city buses and taxis are available, including e-hailing services. Always check schedules and fares before deciding on your preferred mode of transportation. Alternatively, you can rent a car so you can get around at your own convenience.

Trishaw

A great and breezy way of getting around George Town is by trishaw. Be sure to agree on a price before starting your journey – the average rate is RM50 per hour for two persons, depending on the distance between the start and end points.

Ferry

There are two types of ferry services: fast ferries (for pedestrians only) and vehicle ferries (for motorcycles and bicycles). The air-conditioned fast ferries serve the Pengkalang Sultan Abdul Halim (Butterworth) to Swettenham Pier Cruise Terminal (George Town) route while the vehicle ferries serve the Pengkalang Sultan Abdul Halim (Butterworth) to Pengkalang Raja Tun Uda (George Town) route. If you are taking a train to Penang from Kuala Lumpur or other cities, you may board the ferry to the island from Pengkalang Sultan Abdul Halim at Butterworth, located just next to the train station.

Taxi

Taxis are commonly available around the island. It is an easy means of getting around by visitors. Be sure to agree on a price before boarding the taxi. Start by asking how much it is to get to your destination; you can negotiate on the pricing if you feel that it is too high.

E-Hailing Services

Ridesharing apps such as Grab and AirAsia Ride are available in Penang. Simply download the apps to start booking your trips. Payment is either by cash or credit card.

Car Rental Services

Renting a car offers great flexibility and convenience. Rental rate is charged on a daily basis. Just pay a deposit, and you are free to go anywhere on your own! Car rentals are available at the airport and around town. Most hotels can hook you up with one, too.

LinkBike

LinkBike is a bike-sharing system that allows users to pick up a bicycle at any of the 25 self-serve bike stations strategically located on the island and return it to any bike station at their convenience. Download the app and scan the QR code to release the bicycle. Users also can use the LinkBike Card instead of downloading the mobile app to use the service.

Public Bus

The state's public bus service is provided by Rapid Penang and covers an extensive area, both on the island and mainland. It also offers a free Central Area Transit (CAT) bus service within George Town. The terminal at KOMTAR is the central transfer terminal for buses that ply the whole of Penang Island. Simply ask around or look out for signboards to find out which bus route serves you best. Upon boarding the Rapid Penang bus, inform the driver of your destination, pay the amount required and receive a ticket for your trip. Remember to prepare the exact change as all buses do not carry change for safety reasons.

CRUISE TOURISM

The Swettenham Pier Cruise Terminal is Penang Port's latest and most significant addition after a major rebuild in 2010. The new pier accommodates Quantumclass cruise ships, with the main berth capable of handling larger cruise vessels. Among the huge liners that have called at the port are Quantum of The Seas and Ovation of The Seas by the Royal Caribbean Cruisers, and the luxury liner Queen Elizabeth. In addition, other notable cruise operators such as Costa Crociere, Princess Cruises and Celebrity Cruises have also been frequenting Penang Port. The total number of international calls to the port by the end of 2018 was 176, with a passenger load of more than 341,000.

Furthermore, Penang's compact size and good road networks allow photographers to capture the contrast between the state's bustling UNESCO Heritage Site of George Town and the serene 130-million-year-old rainforest, along with its gorgeous shorelines, charming villages, and hidden gems in a matter of days.



MEETINGS, INCENTIVES, CONFERENCES & EXHIBITIONS (MICE)

Penang's unique blend of modernity and Asian traditions, coupled with a well-established hospitality industry, have marked it out as a popular MICE destination. Penang offers business travellers a range of modern, state-of-the-art convention centres, including its largest indoor venue, the Subterranean Penang International Convention and Exhibition Centre (SPICEL), with a maximum capacity of 13,000 people, and the Straits Quay Convention Centre (SQCC) which seats 2,500 people and affords breathtaking views of the sea. The Penang Waterfront Convention Centre (PWCC) and the Penang World City (PWC) convention centre to be located in the island's south-east zone are in the pipeline. Penang also offers a range of unique venues that include historical buildings, iconic landmarks and ecotourism parks, all offering the promise of a memorable backdrop for the perfect event.



PENANG MEDICAL TOURISM (PMED)
